Dr. Kris Grimonprez

She is Visiting Professor entrusted with the courses 'European citizenship' and 'EU citizenship education' at KU Leuven in the Educational masters (future teachers) and the Bachelor European Studies. She gives workshops and lectures at the Faculty of Law and in Teacher Education in a European Perspective. Her work focuses on EU values, such as equality and solidarity, and on case teaching through real-life stories of EU citizens based on case law of the Court of Justice of the European Union. She launched the project Case4EU, empowering EU citizens and published 'EU Citizenship Education' in Oxford University Press Online Encyclopedia of EU Law (OUP 2022) and the books The European Union and Education for Democratic Citizenship: Legal foundations for EU learning at school (Nomos 2020) and European citizenship in the classroom (in Dutch, Leuven University Press 2022).

She holds a degree of Doctor of Laws and an LL.M. Master in European Law of the University of Luxembourg, Master in Laws and Bachelor in Philosophy of KU Leuven.

She is a Post-doc Research Fellow in e-Service-Learning at LUMSA University of Rome. Founding member of the European Association of Service-Learning in Higher Education (EASLHE). She works as a researcher in the ERASMUS+ SLIDE Project "Service-Learning as a pedagogy to promote Inclusion, Diversity and Digital Empowerment" (2021-24) and in the ERASMUS+ e-SL4EU Project "e-Service Learning for more digital and inclusive EU Higher Education systems" (2021-24). Her research interests focus on (e-)Service-Learning, active learning, soft skills development and sustainability. She coordinates the research and projects area of the Postgraduate School "Educare all'Incontro e alla Solidarietà" (EIS-LUMSA). She is cofounder and Vice President of Comparte, a non-profit organization working in rural Guatemala in the field of educational innovation and sustainability.

She holds a Ph.D. in Contemporary Humanism (curriculum Education) at the LUMSA University, with a double degree with the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile (PUC).
